#### ICL 2024 Poznań

The 21st International Congress of Linguists will take place in Poznań from 8 till 14 September 2024. ICL2024 Poznań welcomes twelve plenary speakers. In addition, there will be 17 two-day sections running from syntax to neurolinguistics and clinical linguistics, and 12 one-day focus streams running from language endangerment to language and legal practice. #### Linguistics in Spain: a report

In April 2023, the Spanish Ministry of Universities released a draft royal decree redefining the catalogue of fields of knowledge for the assignment of positions in university faculties. It turned out to effectively exclude Linguistics from being recognized among the descriptors of fields of knowledge. After that, the Spanish Society of Linguistics (SEL) requested and promptly received a document of support from CIPL. What is the situation now, and what are the expectations?
